## Lead-Safe Certification Requirements and Acknowledgement

The Renovation Repair & Painting Rule (RRP) is a federal regulation that requires lead-safety training and certification for anyone who is paid to perform work that disturbs paint in housing and child-occupied facilities built before 1978.

If your home was built before 1978 and you are paying someone to perform work that disturbs six (6) square feet of interior paint or twenty (20) square feet of exterior paint, that person/company must be RRP Certified.
